### BEFORE WE GO

#### TRIP COST

The total cost of the trip is \$285 (a \$50 deposit due upon sign-up). Teams in Atlanta stay at a local church in the city. Teams will be sleeping on the floor, and should plan on bringing mats or air mattresses as well as a sleeping bag or light bedding and a pillow. Teams will have access to water at the church and at their work and outreach sites. Everyone should plan to bring refillable water bottles to stay hydrated throughout the day. A wonderful team of local cooks, alongside *Experience Mission* Summer Staff, will be preparing and serving meals. Breakfast and dinner will be served buffet style, and teams will pack lunches.

#### WHAT TO BRING

- Toiletries (towels, soap, shower shoes, etc)
- Bible, pen and journal
- Water bottle
- Work clothes
  - Pants (no tights or leggings)
  - Closed toed shoes
  - Shorts should be finger tip length
  - Long-sleeved shirts
  - No tight clothing, midriff shirts, short shorts or tank tops allowed outside of housing site.
- Rain jacket or poncho
- Twin air mattress
- Pillow
- Sleeping bag/blanket
