This Morning's Hymns:

Sing Praise To God Who Reigns Above is a 17th century hymn by the German pietist Johann Jacob Schütz. Originally titled *Hymn of Thanksgiving*, it was inscribed with Deuteronomy 32:3.

I will proclaim the name of the Lord.
Ascribe greatness to our God!

The hymn fulfills this purpose and celebrates the greatness of God's grace and power, Divine love and faithfulness, justice and mercy. This is the God of creation and all living things are moved to give *to God all praise and glory!*

To God Be the Glory was written by the prolific gospel hymn writer Fanny J. Crosby (1820-1915), and gained great popularity after 1954 through its use in the Billy Graham Crusades. In contrast to many gospel hymns, this text directs our attention away from personal experience to the glory of God. Crosby articulates the understanding that the primary element in the Christian faith is not a great imperative, that is to say, something that we should do for God. Rather, it is a great indicative, something that God has done for us. God so loved the world that he gave us his Son to make atonement for our sin. All who believe in Christ will receive pardon, will rejoice now and through all eternity because of the "great things he has done."

Live Into Hope was written as a reflection on Luke 4:16-20. In this passage Jesus announces his ministry by reading from Isaiah's proclamation of God's earthly kingdom. "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me...to bring good news to the poor...release to the captives...sight to the blind and to let the oppressed go free." Lives lived in the light of these ministries manifest the Kingdom of God. The hymn was written by Jane Parker Huber. Born in China, the child of Presbyterian missionaries, the author spent most of her childhood years on the campus of Hanover College where her father was president. Ms. Parker Huber still resides in that area and is active in the national office of The Presbyterian Church USA.
