This Morning's Hymns:

The Church's One Foundation presents a portrayal of the church that is clear, positive and biblical. Christ himself is the foundation (I Corinthians 3:11). Its members are his "new creation" (II Corinthians 5:17) through the water of baptism and the word of the gospel. They are also his "holy bride" for whom he gave his life (Ephesians 5:25). All this teaching occurs in the 1st stanza alone! The 2nd asserts further truths: the Church's catholicity ("elect from every nation") and its unity ("yet one o'er all the earth"). The hymn continues by citing the church's challenges and troubles, and ends with the assurance that in the end the church will be, in Christ, triumphant, glorified and at rest.

Christ You Are the Fullness is an unrhymed paraphrase of three essential passages in Paul's letter to the Colossians. The first stanza (chapter 1:15-18) addresses the supremacy of Christ. Our position in Christ is stated in stanza two (3:15-17.) The final stanza instructs us to live doxological lives, that is, lives of thanksgiving and sung praise (3:15-17). The tune *Arirang* is named after a beloved Korean folk song. It traveled to America with U.S. soldiers returning from the Korean Conflict.

Sheaves of Summer (una Espiga) is a Spanish communion hymn and a favorite in Latin America and Hispanic churches in the USA. We will sing the hymn as communion is served, repeating it as needed.

Today We All Are Called to Be Disciples of the Lord was written in 1985 by Rev. H. Kenn Carmichael. It offers a clear statement of our call to serve all those in need, wherever in the world we can. The hymn reminds us that the development of spiritual disciplines is not simply a matter of refraining from old habits. It also is a matter of discerning and practicing new ones—we are not to simply *lay down swords*. We are to *beat them into plowshares*. We are called to a life of love and peace, a discipleship of service.
